
PANDAS: A Guide for Parents

PANDAS stands for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcus. The syndrome involves sudden and often major changes in personality, behavior, and movement in children following an infection involving Streptococcus pyogenes (streptococcal-A infection).



What are the symptoms?

The symptoms of PANDAS start suddenly, about four to six weeks after a strep infection. They include behaviors similar to
obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) and Tourette syndrome. These symptoms can interfere with schooling and quickly
become debilitating. Symptoms worsen and reach their peak usually within two to three days, unlike other childhood
psychiatric illnesses that develop more gradually.

Psychological symptoms may include:

obsessive, compulsive, and repetitive behaviors
separation anxiety, fear, and panic attacks
incessant screaming, irritability, and frequent mood changes
emotional and developmental regression
visual or auditory hallucinations
depression and suicidal thoughts
